## **HOLLAND: Hosting 'Women of the Word' in Haarlem with Susie Sandager:**

Betsy helped arrange a 2-day visit in Haarlem by a group of 40 women from the states, 'Women of the Word'. They were in Israel then came to Holland. One of the purposes of their trip was for Susie Sandager, who dresses like Corrie ten Boom to do a moving presentation called "Corrie Remembers". She did the presentation at Yad Vahem (the holocaust museum in Jerusalem) and then at Corrie ten Boom house in Haarlem. She looks and sounds so much like Corrie ten Boom and continues to give voice to the legacy of this wonderful Dutch lady by using her teachings, stories and devotions to inspire others of faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. Carrie Burns, who Betsy met last year, organized and led the group. The day the group arrived in Holland Christina Cameron, our friend who now lives in Amsterdam, spoke to the group about human trafficking including the topic of prostitution in Holland. She also shared about her work and ministry called the "Scarlet Cord" to reach out to prostitutes in the 'red light district' in Amsterdam. Since prostitution is tolerated in Holland almost every major city has a 'red light district' and the same is true for Haarlem. So after Christina's talk we went on a 'prayer walk' through the Red Light District in Haarlem. This was very confronting to see this but really helped all of us

understand the spiritual state we face each day in this nation and that there is something we can do about it - pray and reach out to the ladies with God's love.

The next day Susie dressed like Corrie ten Boom and shared a devotion and teaching with the groups at the Corrie ten Boom house. She spent time in each of the rooms and it was an awesome day! In the afternoon we all went to the St. Bavo Church in the city center and Susie did another teaching there. What a special time this was to be in the same church where the ten Boom family attended and where Corrie ten Boom did teach on a few occasions.

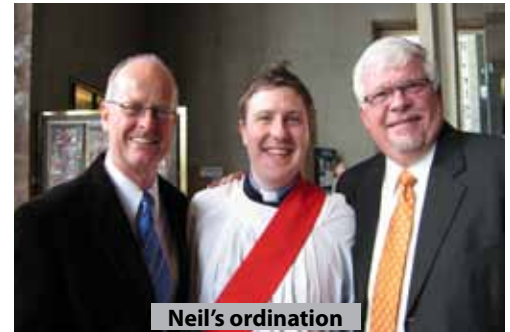
